About Allotment Education

We are a social enterprise working across Nottingham schools, delivering a therapeutic horticultural intervention. We work across Early Years and Key stages 1-2 in mainstream schools. In our SEN schools (Special Education Needs) we support three pathways: Pre-formal, Semi-formal and Formal learners.

We place a strong emphasis on the therapeutic effects of horticulture whilst delivering high quality sessions with high standards of learning and development. We work thoughtfully and proactively to foster a sense of wellbeing in children and young people through exploring horticulture, the joy of food production and wildlife support.

We enrich the existing environments in which pupils learn by creating sustainable gardens and areas for growing food. Engaging with our learners individually by working in small groups of up to 6 is a priority of our work; often reaching children who may struggle to regulate their emotions throughout the school day.

Our focused sessions enable individuals to explore and develop, whilst our school wide, annual Vegetable Takeaway unites the whole school in the excitement of growing food at home.

Snapshot	<p>You will have the chance to create lasting and significant learning experiences in horticulture for pupils who may have never gardened before. This is a role filled with job satisfaction, challenge, hard work and reward. It is a real chance to do something different and see the impacts of your work first hand.</p>

	<p>You will be delivering the Allotment Education syllabus that has evolved through 12 years of working in schools. You will be working in both SEN and mainstream schools, often with children who have additional learning needs. Some of the children with whom you will be working will be pre-verbal. You will be fully supported by Allotment Education in your training and supervision until you are ready to work alone in your schools.</p> <p>We work with some of the most vulnerable children in the city who may be survivors of trauma and/or living with trauma and challenging environments. These children can at times, require an extra layer of patience, kindness, respect and nurture. It is a privilege to work with such vulnerable children, though can be challenging at times.</p> <p>All the tasks encompassed in starting allotments from scratch, raising food and flowers from seed and growing organic produce will be orchestrated by you with the support and guidance of Allotment Education. You will be able to build relationships with the parents and carers at the seasonal plant and produce sales you will deliver each summer and Christmas.</p> <p>If you are passionate about organic vegetable production, skilled at building relationships and enjoy a physically active role in all weathers, this is the job for you.</p>
Job Specification	<p>You will be working independently with small groups of up to 6 children in mainstream education and smaller groups in SEN schools. You may occasionally work with whole classes with the support of school teaching staff.</p> <p>You will deliver the Allotment Education syllabus that will enable children to grow their own food organically.</p> <p>Working spaces under your management will include a polytunnel, school allotment and raised beds. On completion of the school day, you will be required to create a brief update for each school detailing the day's outcomes and children's behaviours. You will then communicate this electronically to pertinent members of the staff team.</p> <p>If children are unable to transition to the allotment outside, you will deliver "tabletop" gardening in the classroom. You will be provided with a trolley and training to facilitate this.</p> <p>Once every 12 weeks you will be required to purchase the materials needed for the Bee Banquet. This will be fully reimbursed by Allotment Education on provision of the relevant receipts.</p> <p>You will be responsible for managing and delivering a school wide Vegetable Takeaway project, where every child in the school is provided with a plant to take home and grow in their own gardens. This will require you to grow approximately 500 high quality vegetable plants, suitable for children to take home. You will be responsible for ensuring quality control across the plants, it will also be your responsibility to ensure every child receives a plant.</p>
